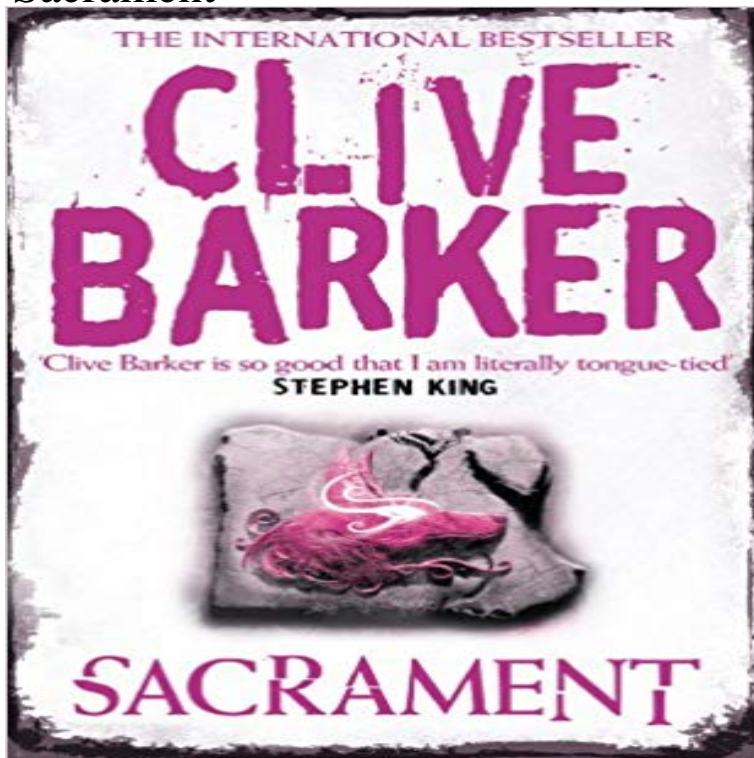


Sacrament
