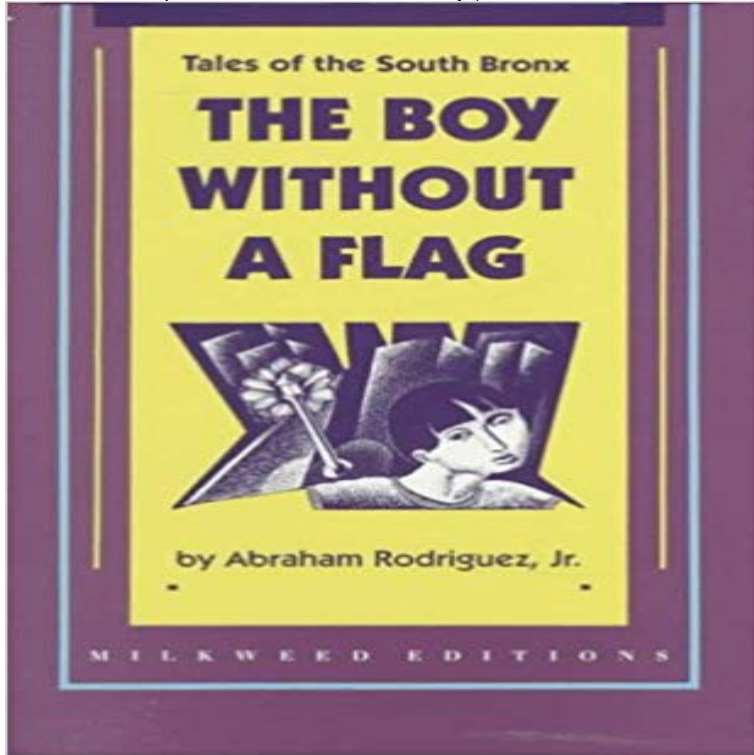


The Boy Without a Flag: Tales of the South Bronx
