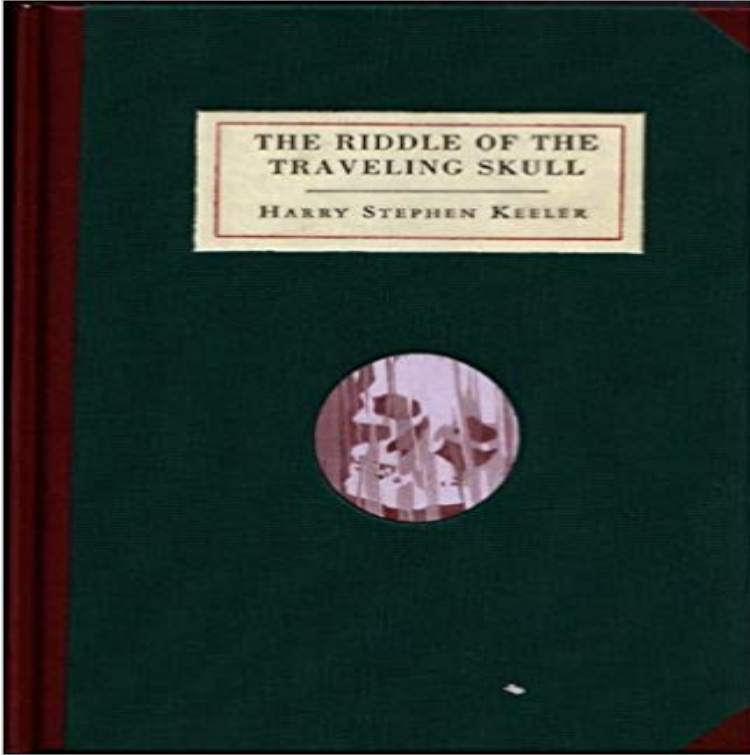


The Riddle of the Traveling Skull
