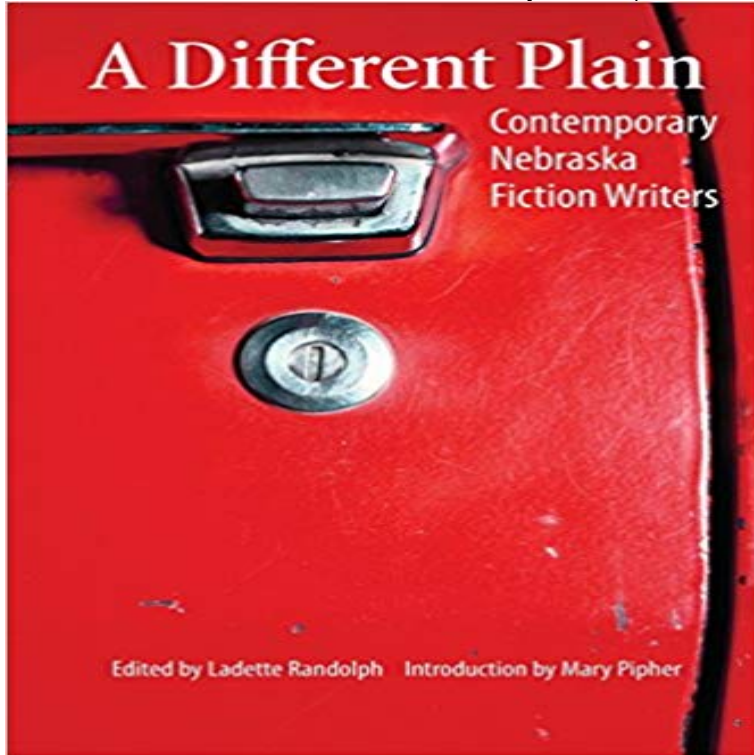


A Different Plain: Contemporary Nebraska Fiction Writers
