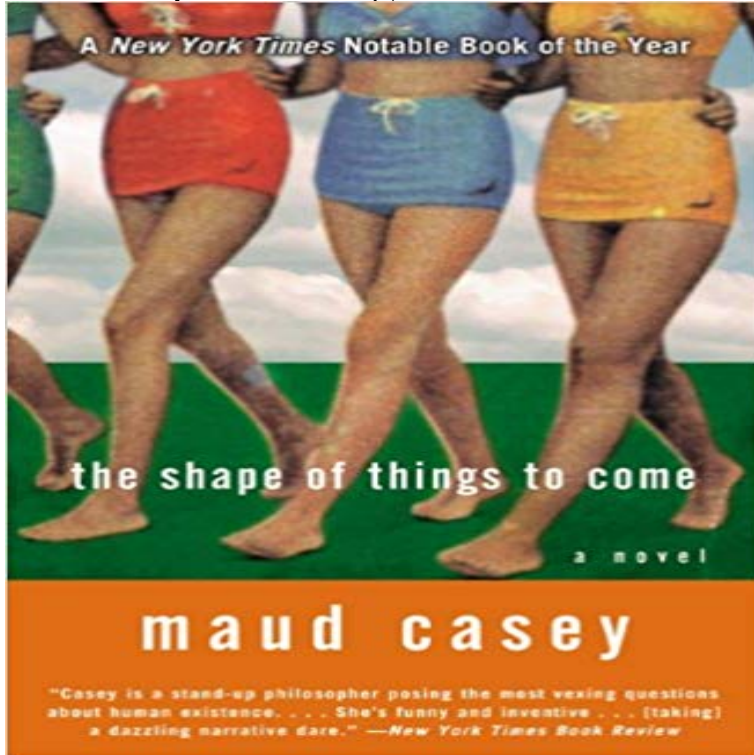


The Shape of Things to Come: A Novel
